## Campus Reminders 2020-2021

**School Day:** 7:55 am - 3:20 pm  
8:10 am - 8:59 am is considered a Late Arrival  
9:00 am - Daily Attendance Time  
(Student considered absent if they arrive after 9:00am)  
3:20 pm - Students signed out before are considered a Leave Early

**Perfect Attendance:** Requires a student to be present the full day, 7:55 am – 3:20 pm, with no absences (excused or unexcused), late arrivals, or leave earlys. All campuses will notify parents regarding excessive late arrivals and leave earlys. This notification may be done through conference or letter, and will include that 5 late arrivals/leave earlys = 1 day absent for compulsory attendance. When a student's absence for personal illness exceeds three consecutive days, the student/parent will be required to present a statement from a physician or health clinic verifying the illness or condition that caused the student's extended absence from school.

**7:30 am – Doors open.** Parents must drop students off in the front by driving through the drop-off lane, stopping at designated check points. Students are NOT allowed to be dropped off and walk across from the parking lot, or outside lane. Parents are asked to remain in the vehicle due to COVID-19. Students will go directly to the homeroom classroom for Grab & Go Breakfast.

**3:20 pm – Pick-up.** Parents must drive through the inside pick up lane. Students will NOT be allowed to walk across to the parking lot, or outside lane, for security purposes. If you have a message/transportation change for your student, please call the office **before** 2:45 pm, so these messages can be delivered.

**VISITORS ON CAMPUS (COVID-19)** The safety of our staff and students remains the campus' primary concern. To help prevent the spread of the virus and reduce the risk of exposure to our staff and students, visitors will be required to complete a simple screening questionnaire before being allowed on campus. Visitors are asked to make an appointment before coming to campus.

- No visitors will be allowed on campus if the CDC or TEA guidelines warrant this action.

**Cafeteria:** Rusk Elementary is a closed campus. No outside food may be delivered to students, they must bring lunch with them upon arrival of the school day.

**Class Parties:** No class parties this year due to COVID19.

**Take Home Folders:** Each student will have a Take Home Folder with class & school information. Parents are required to sign weekly.

**Dress Code:** The district's dress code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disruption, and minimize safety hazards. Students and parents may determine a student's personal dress and grooming standards, provided that they comply with the following:

- Wearing articles of clothing that promote gangs, alcohol, tobacco, and/or drugs is prohibited.
- Clothing with language, pictures, and/or drawings which may be interpreted as obscene will be prohibited.
- Immodest dress will not be allowed, which may include: short-shorts, tank tops, spaghetti-straps and/or strapless dresses or see-through material, inappropriate sleeveless shirts and/or clothing that reveals a bare midriff. All shirts, blouses or any top garment must be buttoned appropriately. Shoes must be worn at all times. No shoes with rollers are allowed.
- Headdress articles will not be permitted. These include headbands, caps, hats, and/or other head ornaments.
- Sunglasses (except by written permission of a physician) or improper eyewear will not be permitted.
- Unusual or non-traditional jewelry will not be permitted. These include nose wear such as rings, studs, tongue rings or studs, and/or other body piercing jewelry of any kind, with the exception of pierced earrings for female students. Male students may not wear earrings.
- Unusual hairstyles considered to be disruptive will not be permitted. These include excessive hair coloring, style, designs in hair, and/or fad haircuts. All styles considered to be potentially disruptive cannot be listed; therefore the school administration will determine whether a particular style is to be considered disruptive and inappropriate.
- Unusual facial make-up or adornments that may be considered to be a possible disruption will not be allowed.

If the principal determines that a student's grooming or clothing violates the school's dress code, the student will be given an opportunity to correct the problem at school. If not corrected, the student may be assigned to in-school suspension for the remainder of the day, until the problem is corrected, or until a parent or designee brings an acceptable change of clothing to

the school. Repeated offenses may result in more serious disciplinary action in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct.

**Lunch Form:** Please refer to Rusk ISD website Family/Student Access, under Food Service Applications.

**Cell Phones:** Students MUST turn cellular devices into the office upon morning arrival, and pick them up at the end of each school day.

**Chromebooks:** Students will be assigned Chromebooks at the beginning of the school year. Devices will travel to school and home with students daily. Students will be required to charge Chromebooks nightly.

**Report Cards:** Report cards require a signature, and must be returned to the student's homeroom teacher.

**Lauren's Law: The Cupcake Law** Per the Texas Legislature, a parent or grandparent may bring in any food product (such as cakes or cupcakes) on the occasion of the child's birthday. However, this law does not require the teacher to stop instruction to allow for the birthday party, does not allow the parent or grandparent a right of access to the classroom, and does not allow balloons, decorations, gifts, etc. The principal has discretion to decide when to allow the consumption of the food product in order to minimize disruption of learning, though the treats cannot be consumed in the cafeteria during meal serving times.
